Dear partners,

Please, find below, our program of workcamps for 2017. We do hope to host many of your motivated volunteers this summer, and that they will have a good time in Belgium. We would like to point out some general remarks and specificities regarding our workcamps:

Workcamps

This year, our workcamps will last 2-3 weeks and will take place from April to October. The number of international volunteers in the camp will vary from 8 to 14. If possible, we try to avoid having more than 2 participants of the same nationality in the camp. Usually English is the camp language, but there are some projects where notions of French are necessary (see workcamps' descriptions).

Conditions for participation

Volunteers should be over 18 year old and there is no maximum age limit. There are no special skills required from volunteers. Participants should be motivated to do voluntary work, be ready to meet the realities of local life and demonstrate flexibility, tolerance and openness to new experiences. There is no extra fee required to participate in our workcamps.

JAVVA17/01 - Red Cross Centre for asylum seekers - Fraipont

FRAIPONT 01/04 to 17/04 SOCI/RENO 10 vols 18+

PARTNER:

The centre for asylum seekers in Fraipont is one of the 24 reception centres managed by the Red Cross in Belgium. Asylum seekers come from Afghanistan, Eritrea, Somalia, Iraq, Syria, Balkans and other parts of the world. They left their country for different reasons such as forced marriage, war, persecution due to religion, sexual orientation or political opinion. Many of them were separated from their family, and they found themselves without any resource or shelter. The Red Cross is mandated by the government for the reception of asylum seekers, and its work in this area adheres to its principles of humanity, independence and neutrality.

The centres provide the following services:

- accommodation and food
- necessary hygienic means
- support and monitoring on the asylum procedure and social support
- medical support
- compulsory education for minors
- cultural and sports activities



The centre "Le Merisier" can host up to 305 residents.

It hosts different kind of family situations: families, childless couples but mostly isolated persons and 50 unaccompanied minors.

The infrastructure of the centre enable it to have, beside the usual accommodation facilities, some convivial areas such as a cinema, a refectory, a games library, a fitness room, a football and volley-ball field...

The center is surrounded by a wood easily accessible.

WORK:

The aim of this workcamp is not only to raise volunteers' awareness about migration issues and enable them to have a personal approach to this topic, but also to bring a breath of fresh air to the residents of the centre.

Volunteers will take part in the community life of the centre and their tasks will mainly consist of some renovation works within the centre but also the organisation of entertainment activities for residents:

- Diverse renovation works will be carried out together with the technical team of the centre (for instance: renovation of some bedrooms, cleaning, painting, recycling workshops,...)
- Activities for the residents organized with the workers in order to understand better the way the centre works : Examples of activities:
- Sport competitions (badminton, indoor football,...)
- Cooking activity
- Entertainment activities for adults: board games, film club,... (depending of volunteer's initiatives)
- Support to the games library
- After school homework help program (for children and teenagers of the centre)
- Walk in the wood

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in the chalet of the centre. Showers and toilets will be provided.

FOOD:

Volunteers will have their meals in the restaurant of the centre with the residents.

If you have a special diet, please let us know in advance.

LOCATION:

Fraipont is a small village in the province of Liège, in Wallonia, the French-speaking part of Belgium. It's situated to the top of a hill. The centre, from Nessonvaux train station, is served by the train and a bus (number 31 destination Nessonvaux). The centre is at 20minutes walking from Nessonvaux train station.



SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- Volunteers are asked to prove a <u>certain interest for the topic</u> of migration and to <u>be willing</u> to interact with asylum seekers. Experience in animation will be appreciated (games, song, entertainment activities, dance...).
- A project-related motivation letter is required.
- Volunteers will have to respect the regulations of the centre. Alcohol is formally prohibited in the centre.

LANGUAGES:

The language of the workcamp is English. Basics of French are useful but not necessary.

TERMINAL:

Brussels International Airport (Zaventem) or Brussels South Airport (Charleroi), by train from Brussels to Nessonvaux train station (meeting point) on 01/04. Train timetables on www.b-rail.be/main/F/

JAVVA17/02 - Special Olympics Belgium

LOMMEL 19/05 TO 31/05 DISA/FEST 14 vols 18+

PARTNER:

Created by Eunice Kennedy Shriver in 1968, « Special Olympics » aim to providing year-round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities. Today, Special Olympics is a global movement serving more than 4 million people with intellectual disabilities in 178 countries and representing 30 different types of sports.

Special Olympics Belgium was founded in 1979 and is officially recognized by the Belgian Olympic and Interfederal Committee. It organises National Games every year (alternatively in Flanders, Brussels and Wallonia) and send delegations of Belgian athletes to the Winter and Summer Special Olympics World Games. These competitions are open to any athlete with intellectual disability who regularly practise a sport at his/her own level. More than just a physical and sport training, these activities enhance the social development of the athletes.

The 2017 National Games will take place in Lommel and will host about 3400 athletes and 1200 coaches from 313 sport clubs to compete in 19 adapted sports and disciplines. The programme will include a torch run, opening and closure ceremonies, an Olympic village, a healthy athletes programme and an art exhibitions from artists with mental disability.

WORK:

For this 35th edition of the Belgian National Games, volunteers will help on several aspects of the event logistics, such as assembling and dismantling of structures, building and putting up the decorations, transport and unloading of material, waste management,... Volunteers will work with several teams of the organisation before and after the Games. During the 3 days of competitions, volunteers will provide guidance to athletes for one of the disciplines of the competition: a precision ball sport, related to bowls and «pétanque» called Bocce. The Opening Ceremony as well as the Torch Run will take place on May 24th while the Games will take place from May 25th to May 27th 2017.

Physical work will be asked to volunteers so it is important to take this into account. Volunteers will also have lighter tasks like guidance of athletes, decorations, waste management,...



ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in the logistic centre of the organisation. Please bring a sleeping bag.

FOOD:

Meals will be taken with the different teams of the organisation and will be prepared by local volunteers. Vegetarian food will be available but should be asked in advance.

LOCATION:

The 2017 National Games will take place in Lommel, a small city, close to the Netherlands, located in the Province of Anvers, in the Dutch-Speaking part of Belgium. Lommel is well known for its white sand, to the Regionaal Toeristisch Bezoekerscentrum (Tourism Office), everything is build around sand and glass. The city is located about 100 km away from Brussels, 70 km of Antwerp and 40 km of Eindhoven. The place of the workcamp can be reached easily by public transport.



SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- This workcamp requires <u>physical efforts</u> at some moments. Volunteers are asked to prove **a strong interest** for the thematic of this event. There will be one free day before and one free day after the competition.
- Please bring good working shoes and clothes that can get dirty as well as a raincoat in case of rainy weather.
- A project-related motivation letter is required.

LANGUAGES:

The language of the workcamp is English. Basics of French are useful but not necessary.

TERMINAL:

SUMMARY OF THE WORKCAMP:

JAVVA17/03 - Eco-centre « La CITE s'invente »

LIÈGE 04/06 TO 20/06 ENVI/RENO 10 vols 18+

PARTNER:

"La CITE s'invente" is a non profit educational organisation for sustainable development. Its mission is to raise awareness about environmental issues and to promote sustainable ways of life.

The main objective of the organisation is to build and design an eco-centre for pedagogical purposes in the hillside (coteaux) of the Citadel of Liège. An eco-centre is a multipurpose facility dedicated to demonstration of innovations and knowledge transfers for environment protection and sustainable development. In addition to the development of the eco-centre, the organisation is carrying out numerous activities related to environment:



- entertainment activities, particularly about compost, biodiversity, vegetable garden, eco-construction, beekeeping, deadheading of fruit trees, healthy food and (soon) permaculture with schools of the neighbourhood and adult groups.
- film production and projections
- fun, educational and ecological machines
- events related to sustainable development (festival,...)

WORK:

The main objective of the workcamp will be to help improving the outdoor and indoor facilities of the ecocentre. Examples of tasks and activities to foresee during the workcamp:

- to finalize the outdoor kitchen area
- to prepare the construction of a future building whose aim is to host groups (the former sheepfold)
- to maintain vegetable gardens (weed, rebuild wood boxes,...)
- to carry out finishing work in the eco-centre with natural materials : sanding the terrace, painting pedagogical frames,...
- · the prepare soil for planting and planting
- to dig new ponds
- to install nest boxes
- to spend one or two days in a permaculture farm in order to learn and to harvest vegetables and fruits for their meals
- to install a tepee in order to host children groups during summer time
- to make bread using the wood oven
- to pick wild plants, to take part to excursions in the area



The exact tasks to be carried out during this workcamp will depend on the progress of the works and the priorities at the time of the workcamps.

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in tents next to the eco-centre. Please bring a sleeping bag and a mattress.

FOOD:

Volunteers will be provided with a kitchen where they will cook for themselves. Food will be local, organic and mainly vegetarian.

LOCATION:

The eco-centre is located in the Saint-Léonard area of Liège, at the foot of the hillside of the Citadel. Liège is the biggest city of Wallonia and the third city of Belgium after Brussels and Antwerp. The hillside of the Citadel is a rural area of more than 90 hectares partly located in the historical centre of Liège, whose the half is classed as Natural Heritage of the Walloon Region. This site has more than 60 monuments recognized as Material Heritage by the Walloon Region and counts 13 km of walking trails. The eco-center is located in an area classified as a «Green zone» and as an area of landscape interest.

SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- This workcamp is targeting volunteers who are sensitive to environmental issues with a strong interest for sustainable development.
- Please bring good working shoes and clothes as well as a raincoat in case of rainy weather.
- A project-related motivation letter is required.

PARTNER:

Clerheid's School is recognized by the French Community of Belgium as a center of meeting and hosting which activities deals around the organization of school camps and holidays camps for kids and teenagers. Every activities take place in the frame of a one week camp.

Educational priorities of Clerheid's School:

- To encourage wonderment, peace, respect of life and what allows life.
- To stimulate solidarity learning and caring of each other.
- To give priority to self- realization and welcome every children, each youngster no matter his/her origin, philosophy, age, character.
- To encourage a good understanding of freedom
- To raise consci<mark>ous</mark>ness to art, responsability and initiative.
- To be especially demanding about enthusiastic motivation of all.
- To allow the awekening of a critical mind.





WORK:

You will have to help in the multiple tasks which will allow the school to organize once again incredible summer camps.

The purpose of the workcamp will mostly be about preparing, renovating and securising the wood village which hosts each year hundreds of kids. This enchanting place is the result of the work and imagination of generations of kids and leaders, and today it extends considerably (more than 20 huts over 2 hectares, a bridge, an amphitheater, a fence...).

This part of the work will include for instance these tasks:

- Reconstruction of the foundation of a wood bridge,
- Replacement of worn or damaged boards,
- Verification of roofs, walls and floors,
- Various wood work.

During the workcamp, we would like volunteers to share with us the everyday life of the school and the maintenance of the domain, especially by doing these tasks:



- To take care of the animals (a horse, two donkeys, sheeps and chickens),
- To prepare the fields and to repare the fences,
- Forest maintenance (picking up, and storage of the wood) and of the 12 hectares of field (grassland, stream)
- · Construction of a dry stone wall.

Tasks are enough diverse so that there is something to suit all tastes.

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will live in a small cottage, with a kitchen, a bathroom and two bedrooms (2 x 4 beds), as well as in a dormitory with a bathroom. Bring your sleeping bag.

FOOD:

Volunteers will either take their lunch with groups during the camps or they will cook by themselves in the kitchen at their disposal.

LOCATION:

Clerheid's School is located in a hamlet in the province of Luxembourg, in Wallonia, the french speaking part of Belgium. The field of activity is situated between 350 and 550 meters of altitude, away from major roads on a crest of the Ardennes.

SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- The school is a place quite isolated, where there is a few public transport. The closest town, Marche-en-Famenne is at 30 minutes by car.
- Internet is in limited access in the office of the organisation.
- A project-related motivation letter is required.

LANGUAGES:

The hosting team speaks French, English, Italian and a bit of Dutch but any other languages are welcomed!

JAVVA17/05 - Jalna Natural Reserve

HEURE 01/08 TO 12/08 RENO/ENVI 10 vols 18+

PARTNER:

The Belgian Royal League for Bird Protection is an organisation founded in 1922 that works to promote conservation and protection of birds and the wider environment. Since 1997, The League has a "Nature Centre" in Namur Province. The centre hosts families, groups of youngsters and adults, organisations or schools willing to organise nature holidays, family holidays, study weekends, or any other activity related to nature and in a pleasant and relaxing environment.

This beautiful domain of 15 ha is a natural reserve that counts not less than 559 plant species, 953 kinds of mushrooms, 203 spider species, 223 kinds of night butterflies, 50 kinds of day butterflies et 99 bird species. The centre propose different activities: guided tours of the natural reserve, theme activities (birds, animal footprints, plants, biodiversity, beavers, beehives,...), farm village tour, natural cooking (dandelion jam, nettle soup,...). The rates of the stay are very democratic and all the incomes are entirely dedicated to nature conservation.

WORK:

The aim of this workcamp is to renovate the "Nature Centre" which is surrounded by the natural reserve.

More concretely, the work will be mainly dedicated to painting and renovation work. And if time allows it, they will carry out some work in the natural reserve, like to parks and some gardens maintenance: removing the over-grown grass...

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in a dormitory within the nature centre. Please bring a sleeping bag.

FOOD:

Volunteers will be provided with a kitchen and they will cook their meals themselves.

LOCATION:

This beautiful domain is located in a village called Heure, in the hollow of the green hills of Famenne. The village is located at about 10 km from Marche-en-Famenne and about 40 km of Namur, in the French-speaking part of Belgium. The centre of the village is located at 1 km. There is very little access to public transportation and there isn't any store or bar in the area.



SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- This workcamp is designed for <u>nature lovers</u> who are not afraid of outdoor work in an **isolated place** (<u>no wifi</u>).
- Please bring good working shoes and clothes as well as a raincoat in case of rainy weather.
- A project-related motivation letter is required.

JAVVA17/06 - Festival Théâtres Nomades

BRUSSELS 10/08 TO 25/08 FEST 8 vols 19

PARTNER:

Since its creation in 1994, "La Compagnie des Nouveaux Disparus" strives to give access to culture and -particularly theatre - to a socially disadvantaged public, less inclined to cultural activities. Democratisation of culture and promotion of diversity are the guiding principles of the company's activities. These are divided in three types of projects: theatre plays creation, "Theâtres Nomades" festival and Mimouna Festival.

Every summer for the past 10 years, the Brussels Royal Park has hosted more than 60 theatre shows over 4 days for the Brussels theatre festival. The fountain and surrounding area are metamorphosed into a colourful nomad village made of marquees, caravans, Berber tents, and open-air stages.

The programme is diversified through various shows for children, a circus, street theatre, classical theatre, puppet shows, as well as creative workshops on the stage of the Royal theatre of Brussels.

WORK:

Volunteers will help on several aspects of the festival logistics, such as meals preparation for the entire team of the festival, assembling and dismantling of tents, building and putting up the decorations, stage-managing, transport and unloading of material, installation of the "village of organisations", waste and composting toilet management,...Volunteers will work with all people working on the festival (technicians, stage managers, facilitators, organizers, cooks...). Volunteers who have sufficient knowledge of French will have the opportunity to take part in promotion activities together with artists in Brussels metro before the festival. Volunteers will also be integrated in the different teams during the festival (tickets, bar, catering, stage-managing,...) which will take place from August 17th to August 20th 2017.

Heavy physical work will be asked to volunteers so it is important to take this into account. Volunteers will also have lighter tasks like meal preparation, waste management,... Depending of the programme schedule, volunteers may also have the possibility to actively take part in entertainment activities of the festival.

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in caravans on the site of the festival. The living conditions are very rudimentary close to conditions of a "scout camp". Volunteers will use dry toilet placed in the park and will have to maintain it. Volunteers will have to respect the time constraint regarding the showers. Please bring your sleeping bag, sheets and toiletries.

FOOD:

Meals will be taken with the diverse teams of the festival and will be prepared by the volunteers together with the kitchen team of the festival. Sandwiches will be prepared for lunch and a warm meal for dinner. Vegetarian and halal food will be available.

LOCATION:

Volunteers will be in the centre of Brussels, the capital of Belgium, at two steps of the Royal Palace. The site is easily reachable by public transport.

SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- This workcamp requires **hard physical efforts** at some moments and a active participation and involvement of volunteers during 2 weeks, due to the deadlines set for the good progress of the festival. Volunteers are asked to prove a strong interest for the thematic of the festival. There will be only 3 free days during the workcamp: one day before, one day during and one day after the festival.
- Please bring good working shoes and clothes that can get dirty as well as a raincoat in case of rainy weather. If you have a music instrument or juggling material, feel free to bring it!
- A **certain knowledge of French is preferable** in order to be able to join the promotion activities and to be integrated in some teams during the festival.
- A project-related motivation letter is required.

PARTNER:

The Centre "Arthur Regniers" hosts people suffering from cerebral palsy or from other motor disabilities. The aims of this Medical Teaching Institute is to provide educational support, health care, and well-being to the teenagers and adults of the centre and also lend support to their families. The centre provides a open-space, various activities, and technical support in order to promote the social, professional and cultural autonomy of the residents.

WORK:

Volunteers will be asked to give support to the residents of the centre for some basic needs (such as helping with the meals,...) and to participate in the organization of artistic and cultural activities, discussion groups, various workshops and excursions together with the centre's staff. These activities will take place on the site of Bienne but also on another site (Thuin).

WORK:

WORK:

This means to help the team during the school camps and holiday camps by preparing activities and leading them with the team day by day. They organize several kind of camps and school camps (circus, philosophy and nature, campsites in caravan...) for children from 4 to 13 years old.

It will be asked to the volunteers to lead games, to participate to night watches and to help the animation team to offer a serenity framework to children. Musicians, singers, dancers, acrobats, ventriloquists and others artists are warmly welcome!
